

FHFOA is now working with Louisiana's Disability Assessment & Coordination Entity (DACE) to strengthen disaster planning and recovery for people with disabilities — ensuring no one is left behind.

**The Disability Assessment & Coordination Entity**

**What is DACE?**

- We are here to help the disability community prepare for and recover from disasters.
- We are a bridge between emergency management and the disability community.

**PREPARE**

We provide emergency preparedness trainings, meetings, and outreach in all regions of the state. Everything we do is to meet the unique needs of the disability community.

**RECOVER**

When disaster does strike, we meet survivors where they are — often in shelters or impacted areas — to help with recovery by connecting them to resources and support.

**Who should be involved?**

People with disabilities and their families, organizations who support the disability community, local government, and emergency management professionals.

**Why is this important?**

People with disabilities are 2-4 times more likely to be seriously hurt or lose their lives in disasters.

Many face barriers to evacuation, shelter access, communication, and medical care.

- LaCAN (Louisiana Council's Advocacy Network) furthers the Council's mission by advocating for policies and systems that support inclusion everywhere



people learn, work, live, and play.

- LaCAN advocates for service systems that support children and adults with disabilities to live in their own homes and be fully-included and participating members of their local schools and communities.
- LaCAN provides information and support to individuals wishing to effectively advocate for systems change in the areas of home and community-based services, education, and employment.
- Regional LaCAN teams include individuals with disabilities, their family members, and professionals. These members are notified by email or phone when communication with state agency officials, legislators or the Governor is necessary.

### Guiding Principles

- Children, regardless of the severity of their disability, need families and enduring relationships with adults in a nurturing home environment to develop to their fullest potential.
- Adults with developmental disabilities should be afforded the opportunity to make decisions for themselves, live in typical homes and communities, and exercise their full rights and responsibilities as citizens.
- People with developmental disabilities, regardless of the severity of their disability, should have the opportunity and support needed to gain and maintain competitive, integrated, individualized employment.
- All students, with or without disabilities, should be provided the same opportunities to be educated in neighborhood schools as their sisters, brothers, friends, and neighbors.
- All students, with or without disabilities, should be provided with the support to learn together effectively, involving family, school, and community.

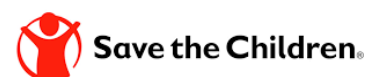

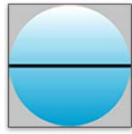
